



Thank you so much for the warm welcome. We enjoyed every minute we spent in and around Jewel Box Ponds. I am the waterlily enthusiast in our family, and my husband kindly supports me in my hobby. We live in Cedar Rapids, IA, and the SLWGS Jewel Box ponds display alone is worth the 4.5-hour drive to St. Louis.

While waterlilies are generally a sight for sore eyes by themselves, I really appreciate that you put out the planting maps so I know what I am looking at. It was interesting to compare the huge King of Siam in Pines pond to my tiny plant I grow in a 2ft barrel (yet she blooms non-stop during summer for me, too). Nice example of how adaptable some cultivars are. Another interesting comparison was the Queen of Siam July 2022 vs. August 2023. Last year, we visited in late July, and, as far as I remember, her viviparous pads didn't have any plantlets on them back then. I take it she is not as strongly viviparous as, for example, Dauben, Innocence or Crystal (and it was good to compare this year's Crystal to Innocence you displayed last year, too).

Thanks again for the warm welcome and for all your wonderful work you and your friends do for the community, to make the beautiful city of St. Louis even more beautiful. We're looking forward to coming back next summer, hopefully the weather will cooperate better when we return.
