Hello Members!


If you still have a feather flag making a splash at your place, it's time to swim it back to us. We would really appreciate it if you would please return all feather flags this year.





## **History of the Jewel Box**

The Jewel Box in St. Louis, Missouri, is a renowned greenhouse in Forest Park. Its rich and notable history reflects the city's dedication to horticulture and architectural beauty.

#### **Origins and Construction**

• Concept and Design: The Jewel Box was conceived as part of St. Louis's efforts to enhance its public spaces. Designed by William C. E. Becker, it features an Art Deco style. The structure was intended to showcase floral displays and horticultural exhibits.

Construction: The Jewel Box was constructed in 1936 during the Great Depression. It was funded by the Works Progress Administration (WPA), a New Deal program aimed at providing public works jobs. The building is made primarily of glass, with about 4,000 panes supported by steel and reinforced concrete. The reflective pools in front of the Jewel Box were part of the original design and construction to enhance the structure's aesthetic appeal. They were implemented simultaneously with the building of the Jewel Box itself to create a harmonious and visually striking environment. The landmark has been open in 1936

#### **Features and Renovations**

• **Design Elements**: The Jewel Box is 50 feet high, 55 feet wide, and 144 feet long. Its innovative use of glass and steel was ahead of its time, allowing for abundant natural light. The structure includes an aluminum roof and glass walls that can be opened during warm weather.

**Renovations**: The Jewel Box has undergone several renovations to maintain its beauty and functionality over the years. A significant renovation, costing around \$3.5 million, occurred in 2002. This renovation included updates to the heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems, structural repairs and aesthetic improvements.

#### Significance and Use

- **Horticultural Displays**: The Jewel Box is primarily used for floral displays and plant exhibitions. It hosts a variety of seasonal flower shows, including elaborate displays during the spring and Christmas seasons. Before the renovation that took place in 2002.
- Events and Weddings: The Jewel Box is also popular for weddings and other special events. Its picturesque setting and stunning architecture make it a favored location for ceremonies and receptions.

Cultural Importance: The Jewel Box is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, recognizing its architectural significance and its role in St. Louis's cultural history.

### Legacy


