
This summer, in addition to the beautiful tropical and hardy waterlilies at the Jewel Box, we are experimenting with a display of aquatic plants that have edible parts. The plants are in the main display pond and growing in the summer warmth.

What you will see in the display:

#### Water Mimosa (Neptunia oleracea)

A water mimosa is a floating legume with leaves that close upon touching. The shoot tips and pods are eaten raw (e.g., Lao papaya salad) and cooked (e.g., Yam phak crochet, a Thai salad with cooked shoots ) in Southeast Asia. The flavor is similar to cabbage.

It's essentially a unique spiny waterlily native to Asia. The seeds of the gorgon lily are popped and consumed in India under the name fox nuts or makhana.



#### What about rice?

This is an obvious edible aquatic and the only one that is truly a staple in many diets. I've attempted to start an ornamental variety called 'Black Madras', known for its dark purple leaves. However, this variety has been terribly slow growing – perhaps it will debut later in the season.

## **HELP NEEDED!**




