Jane Sueme started beekeeping in 2004 when she noticed the lack of pollinators in her garden. Five years later, she opened our area's first beekeeping supply business. Since 2006 when the phenomenon known as colony collapse disorder escalated.

Honeybees have been disappearing. She will share her vast knowledge about the phenomenon of colony collapse disorder and how we can help to reverse it.

Jane Sueme and Scott Klein opened Isabee's Beekeeping Supplies in 2009 and currently engage in a wide range of activities including retail equipment sales, education, consulting, and caring for their own honeybees.

Jane became hobbyist beekeepers in 2004 and have been actively involved in building the local beekeeping

community ever since. Jane served as a board member of the Eastern Missouri Beekeepers Association from 2004 to 2012 and as Communications Coordinator for the Heartland Apicultural Society in 2012 and 2013. Scott designs and manufactures native bee nesting blocks and provides education about native bees and honeybees. You can learn more about native bees at NativePollinator.com

## What's for Dinner? Part 1 by Greg Heck

This summer, in addition to the beautiful tropical and hardy waterlilies at the Jewel Box, we are experimenting with a display of aquatic plants that have edible parts. The plants are in the main display pond and growing in the summer warmth.

What you will see in the display:

### **Taro** (Colocasia esculenta)

Also known as "elephant ears", taro has a starchy corm (bulb-like base) and leaves that are edible once cooked. Several ornamental varieties are planted: 'Black Coral,' 'Mojito,' 'Waikiki,' and 'Teacup.'

#### **Lotus** (*Nelumbo* species/hybrids)

Their edible starchy rhizomes are filled with chambers allowing air to penetrate the rhizome, which grows shallowly in the mud. The ornamental variety, 'Decorated Lantern,' is planted. Lotus root recipes: https://

### Chinese Water Chestnut (Eleocharis dulcis)

The edible corms (technically not bulbs but corms like gladiolus) send up reed-like leaves and then spread rhizomes in the mud, forming new starchy corms harvested at the end of the growing season.



The code is a unique design that will enable you to link directly to a website when scanned by your smartphone. It takes you to the Pond-O-Rama page on the posters and brochures, to the membership sign-up page on the membership cards, and to the Jewel Box page on the signage at the Jewel Box.

To scan a QR code:

- 1. Open the camera app on your phone
- 2. Center the QR code on your phone screen (You may need to move the phone closer or further from the code)
  - 3. Tap the link that pops up
- 4. Pat yourself on the back for being so tech-savvy!
